Online celebrations

Thinking of celebrating and raising funds online? There are several ways to set up, promote and fundraise for your special day.

Aries made a dramatic entrance into this world on 15 March, 2019. He was born on the front seat of the family car in front of the emergency department and lost 1kg just four days after birth. Tests revealed that Aries was in kidney failure and had Grade 5 kidney Reflux, Dysplasia of both kidneys and chronic kidney disease.

Mum, Madison explains; "We were able to take Aries home but he was on medications six times a day. For the next three months we were seen daily for blood tests to check his kidney function. It then changed to every two weeks, then four weeks and now it's every three months."

To celebrate Aries first birthday the family decided they wanted to give back. Kidney Health Australia had been an important source of support, with the information and resources on the website helping them over the course of their journey. Madison created their own online fundraising page for family and friends to donate in lieu of gifts.

"It was so easy to set up and personalise and my family and friends also found donating money this way easy and simple. I loved that I could share the direct link via social media" shares Madison.

The family raised an amazing **\$700** in honour of Aries to support other families affected by kidney disease.

Donate first!

By donating to your own fundraiser you are showing commitment and setting the benchmark for other donations.

Include a picture of yourself and tell your story.

People want to see who they are donating to and they want to hear your unique kidney story, so let your supporters know why you are doing what you are doing. The more personalised you make your page, the better.

Let people know how much to donate and make it relevant to you.

You could ask your family and friends to donate a dollar amount equal to your age or wedding anniversary. Instead of a present, you could ask for the equivalent amount be donated to **Kidney Health Australia**.



Share your fundraising page on social media.

Share your page across different platforms, as well as regular updates on your activity. Don't forget to ask your friends to share your page too.

Thank your donors.

Let them know their donation has been noticed and appreciated. Nothing makes a person feel more special than when you

thank them individually.

Ask again!
